ADVANCED PLACEMENT

Grades of 4 and 5 are awarded credit accordingly (and grades of 3 in foreign languages\*):

NOTES:

1. The student loses AP credit if he or she chooses to take the equivalent course here. For example, AP credit in American History is lost if the student takes HIS 230, 240.
2. AP credit in English does not automatically meet the expository writing basic skills requirement; nor does it fulfill any other general education requirement. It serves as elective credit only.
3. Despite the equivalencies noted above, only two general education requirements may be fulfilled through Advanced Placement credit: one social studies division requirement and one science division requirement (provided the course equivalency matches a course that fulfills a general education requirement).

INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE

Generally, credit is awarded for grades of 6 or 7 on higher level exams (and for a higher level grade of 5 in foreign languages, subject to validation by placement test).

CLEP

Centre College does not award credit for CLEP scores.
