The Kentucky Tourism Cabinet honored The Great American Dollhouse Museum by designating it one of Kentucky's 50 "Only Ones," meaning that it is an attraction which is globally unique. The gift shop features a large

selection of miniatures. (Several Centre faculty, staff, and Centre spouses are the creators of the museum).
